He loved it. It's just cool, and for me re-defines - or re-frames - the idea of design. It's not about the matching side tables or the right

shade of green, it's about what spills out of you - and then inspires you. Living with such inspiring surroundings is what real design is. A "designer" can help you arrange this, but a really good designer won't impose it - they can't. Most of us are too afraid to trust this intuition. There are of course basic design elements to consider and learn about, but first and foremost it has to be about you - about your life story - where you're at and where you hope to go.
