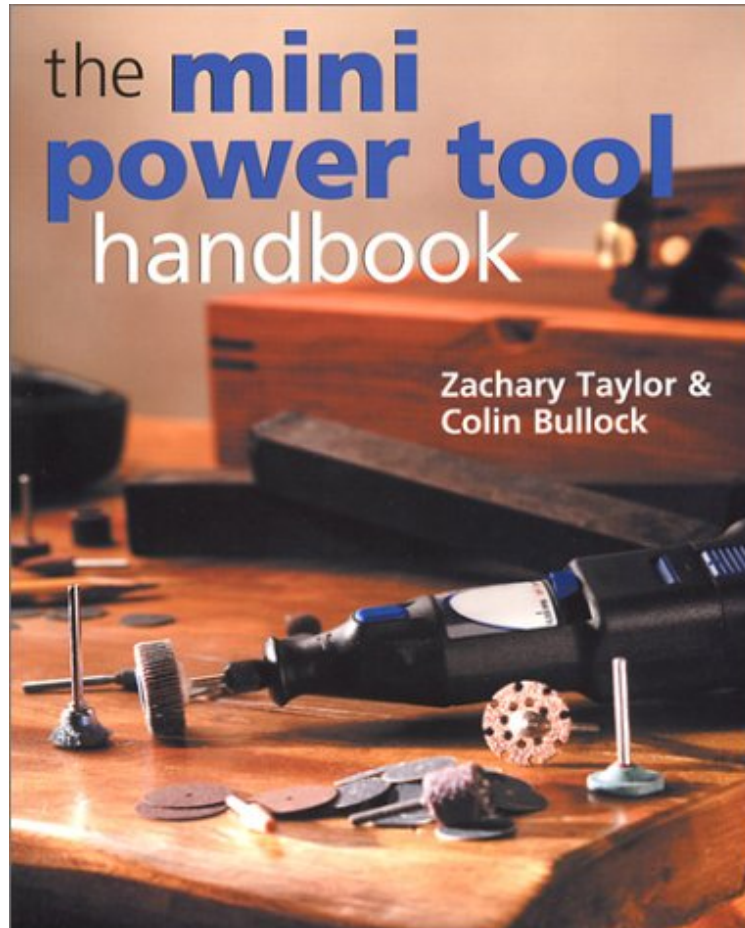

The author makes sure that the new owner knows exactly how to use his/her mini power tool, complete with directions concerning safety and some maintenance. Taylor delves into many different sections, but only shallowly. To make a book that covered each section in depth would require another four hundred pages, with photos. Some things depended upon prior knowledge, such as the router section, but that's fine. They probably all had the same need, but since I knew most of the subjects covered already, I felt like I was reviewing more than learning. Still, reviews are important, especially with power tools. Just because a tool is small doesn't change the fact that you need to know safety practices. Overall, a good, basic
