By Greg Taylor: As far as I can ascertain from my brief bit of research this is a somewhat Kindleized version of Gaillard Hunt's 4 volume collection of Madison's Letters and Writings. My complaints are not against the writings themselves. It is an okay collection, very letter centric. But it is practically useless in this format as a research tool. If you are reading, e.g., Ketcham's biography of Madison and he makes reference to a 1803 letter of Madison to Monroe, good luck finding it quickly. First, you have to find the overall table of contents and link to the right volume, then link to the right year and then page through that year and hope Hunt included it. Slow, tedious and annoying. The Online Library of Liberty has an electronic version of Hunt's 9 volume collection of Madison's papers. Use that instead. Or wait until the publishing world catches up to the fact that while ebooks are cool, they are only as useful as publishers make them to be. At the moment, they haven't caught on to the fact that there is a market for good, well formatted version of the classics in good translations and editions and for American history and political theory in good editions. Until they wake up to that, ebooks like the Kindle will not be a decent research tool nor the basis for a great personal library.
