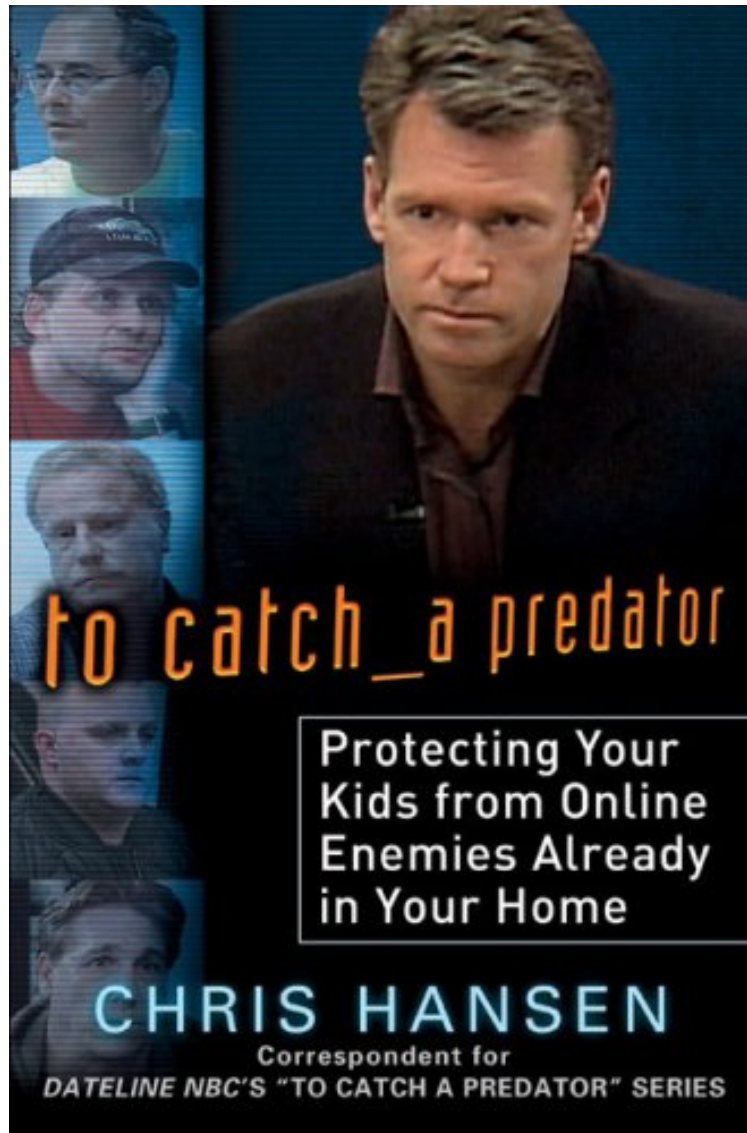

Actually if you watch the "To Catch a Predator Raw Tapes" you'll see that Chris Hansen says the exact same things (literally word for word) in the book. I found the "Other Victims" chapter interesting - he covers the story from the predator's wife's point of view. To sum up, if you're a parent that has no idea what the internet is then I guess it's a good book to read.

Hansen takes readers deep into the world of child predators to show what we can do to protect ourselves and our families. Police sergeant Rick Woody thought he was doing everything in his power to protect his thirteen-year-old daughter, Kacie, on and off line. He kept the computer in the living room facing out, he sometimes checked her chats and e-mails, and he made sure Kacie knew not to give out her address or any other personal information. But neither Kacie nor Rick knew that her "seventeen-year-old" friend Dave from California was actually a forty-nine-year-old child predator until it was too late. Such victims inspired Dateline to create the "To Catch a Predator" series that investigates online predators. Now, correspondent Chris Hansen shares the many stories of the victims who have motivated him to speak out. These are stories of parents, children, wives, and families, who have had their lives shattered by child predators. Their accounts expose the twisted psychology and workings of men who prey on children and teens, how they manipulate their victims and their loved ones, and the way they've destroyed children, families, and communities.
