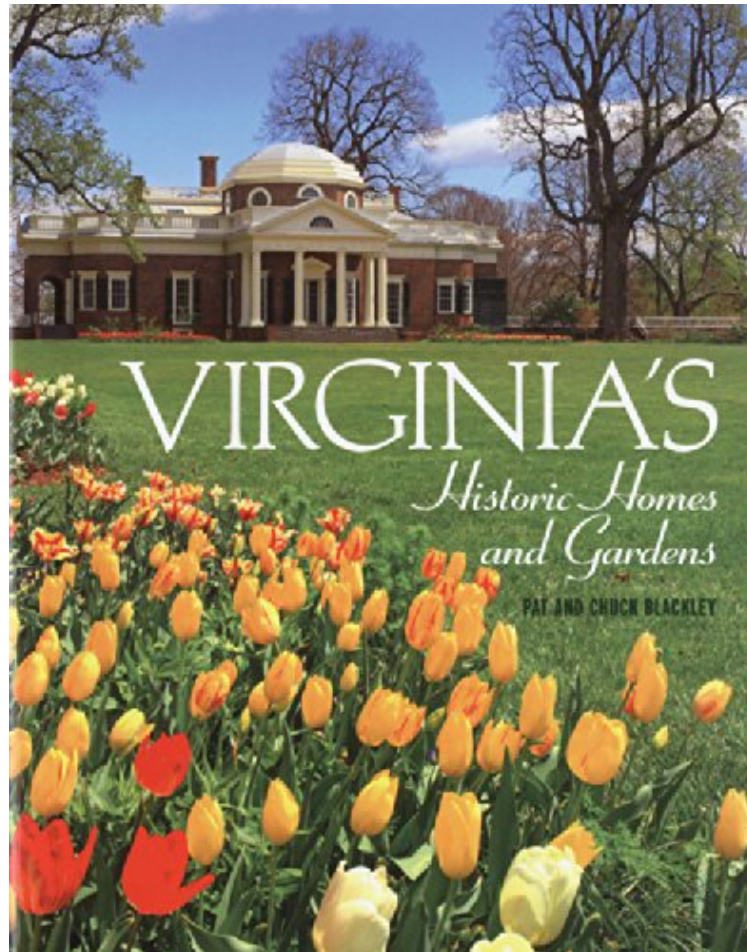

We're treated to gorgeous exterior, interior and garden shots that will make architects, historians, and architectural historians catch their breath. Pat and Chuck Blackley are skilled photographers, well known and respected for their work in architectural history. You will not be disappointed with this slice of shots from their enormous portfolio.What you may not know is that they are also skilled writers, and each entry in the book is framed by an essay of historical and social depth. From the James River Plantations to the Shenandoah foothills, *Virginias Historic Homes and Gardens* celebrates the legendary houses and landscapes of Old Dominion. Virginia natives, the authors travel throughout the state to highlight the best of the famous and lesser-known homes. Including such national landmarks as George Washingtons Mount Vernon and Thomas Jeffersons Monticello, the book brilliantly illustrates the homes exteriors and interiors as well as their gardens and landscaping. Historical details accompany the exquisite color photographs, along with useful information on each sites location.

The real appeal of the Blackleys latest offering is in the eye candy found on nearly every page. The sharp details and lush colors in each photograph are mentally mouth-watering. But, beware. If you think you will be able to read this book and then resist the temptation to actually visit one or more of these historical delicacies, you could be sadly mistaken.
