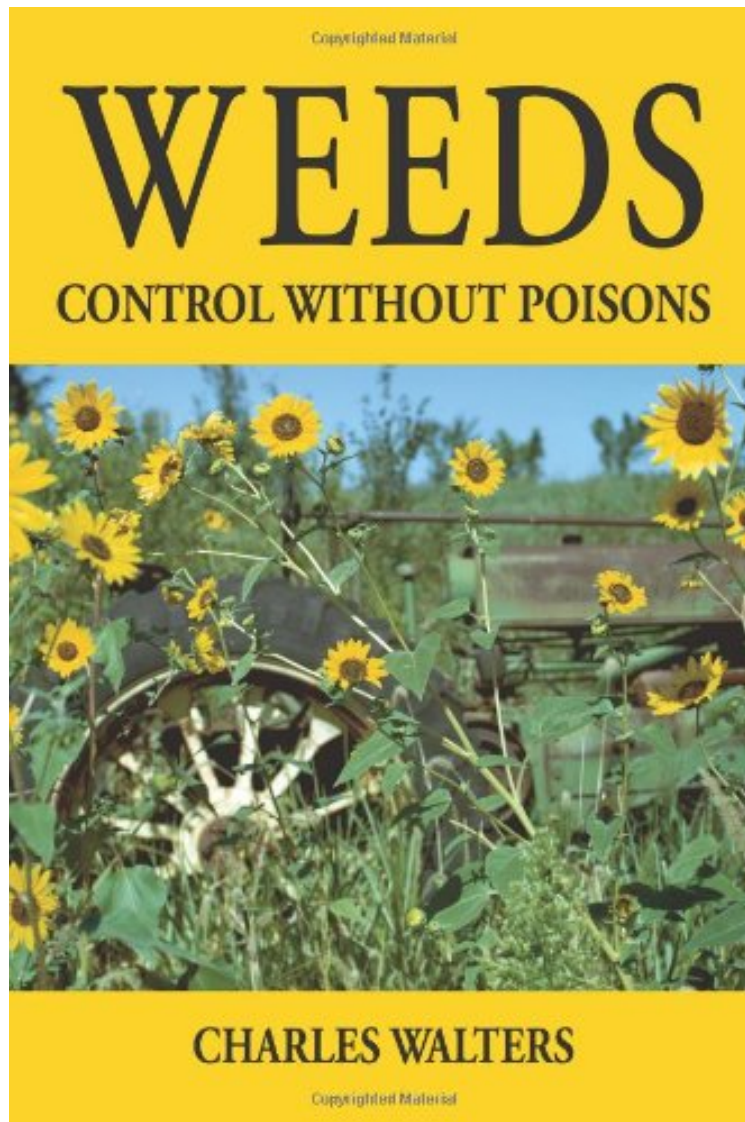

The vitalist works with nature to promote healing where the atomist works by "acting upon" a natural process and changing it thru' surgery, chemicals etc. Walters says that by paying closer attention to your weeds, they will tell you a LOT about the condition of your soil. If you give your body the nutrition it needs, it has the ability to heal itself. Similarly with soil. Too much crabgrass can indicate there is not enough calcium in the soil. Correct the nutritional imbalance and your garden soil will no longer be hospitable to crabgrass. There is a lot of good information in this book aimed towards helping you control weeds without poisons. The wide scale poisoning of our planet thru' chemical pesticides and herbicides is creating wide spread health problems and killing the very planet we need to live on. We have no other place to go but extinct unless we start addressing this problem. People have been brainwashed by chemical companies to think large scale farming is impossible to do organically but still it is being done has been proven it can be done.
