Small 44 page book filled with fluff. I can not imagine anything in this book that common sense does not tell you. An example: It suggests you rotate your crops and make compost. No instructions, just tells you to do it. It recommends asking neighbors and local extension offices as your sources of learning. Tells you to know your zone, but no map included. Just a pitiful little, probably self-published, book with no real information.
